Harvest Heroes

7,215 POUNDS OF PRODUCE HARVESTED

We **tripled our harvest this year** thanks to a garden expansion partnership with Geezer Farm. Countless individuals, students, businesses, and non-profit organizations also supported Jones Garden and generously contributed in ways great and small. We are deeply grateful to each of you for your ongoing support.



Volunteer Hours

We had **95** faithful and helpful friends who gave their time to maintain the garden, resulting in more than **332 volunteer hours**. We could not have accomplished our work without them.



Donors

The community's generosity was overwhelming this season, with 78 individuals, businesses, farms, and grantors contributing more than \$78,000 to the garden this year.



Produce Given

Anyone who volunteers at the garden receives free produce from our harvest. We were proud to provide more than 1,236 pounds of free vegetables to our community this season.



Produce Sold

The community purchased about \$3,495 worth of produce this season, providing much-needed revenue to help our community garden grow. All proceeds are put back into garden operations.

Partnership with Geezer Farm

Norm Shafer, owner of Geezer Farm just outside of Staunton, provided a plot of land for us to grow additional produce at no extra cost. As we prepare to launch our expansion, this temporary growing space allowed us to increase our yields by 76 percent! We had more produce than ever for the community on Market Days and launched our Food Delivery Program for the elderly. As a bonus, we learned even more about sustainable gardening from Norm. Garden Labs

We host free workshops in our garden from May to September, made possible by our community partners. Local professionals lead fun, educational sessions on topics centered around sustainable agriculture.

Composting Program

Neighbors help to enrich our soil with organic food waste. We provide the compost collection container, and once filled, neighbors exchange the container of composting materials for free produce on Market Day.

Food Delivery Program

Our food deliveries are an extension of the composting program designed specifically for the elderly. Each participant receives a compost collection container that we swap out for a bag of fresh vegetables each week.

Enrichment Programs

Sample Saturday and Story Night offer food inspiration and community engagement. Sample Saturday allows Market Day visitors to taste recipes made with food grown in our gardens. Story Night promotes literacy for the young and young at heart, connecting them to the garden through storytelling.
